

THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE EAST DUBLIN MAYOR AND COUNCIL

February 9, 2015

The regular meeting of the East Dublin Mayor and Council was called to order by Mayor George H. Gornito.

Invocation was led by Councilman Brown followed by pledge to the flag.

A motion was made by Councilman Jackson and seconded by Councilman Brown to approve the minutes of the previous meeting. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion to approve the bills was made by Councilman Williams and seconded by Councilman Tanner. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion was made by Councilman Jackson and seconded by Councilman Williams to add "Water Tank Shelter Bids" to the agenda. All voted in favor with none opposed.

The following bids for the water tank shelter were presented:

Randy Williford	\$1,800.00
Dale Watson	\$2,000.00
Charles Williams	\$2,381.83

After discussion, a motion was made by Councilman Tanner and seconded by Councilman Jackson to accept the lowest bid from Randy Williford in the amount of \$1,800.00 for the construction of a shelter at the 250,000 gallon water tank on Buckeye Road. All voted in favor with none opposed.

The following items were presented to the Mayor and Council as surplus property:

A motion was made by Councilman Williams and seconded by Councilman Jackson to surplus the above listed items and advertise each item on Govdeals.com for bid. All voted in favor with none opposed.

After discussion on the bids for the surplus property, a motion was made by Councilman Brown and seconded by Councilman Tanner to accept each bid. All voted in favor with none opposed.

Discussion was made on the intergovernmental agreement with the Laurens County Election Superintendent. The agreement is for the City to rent a minimum of 3 touchscreen voting machines from Laurens County. It was discussed that there was not a clause in the agreement that would relieve the City of paying for the use of the voting machines in the event there was no Election.

After discussion, a motion was made by Councilman Jackson and seconded by Councilman Tanner to adopt the intergovernmental agreement with an amendment clause relieving the City of any obligation of payment in the event of no election. All voted in favor with none opposed.

After discussion of bids, a motion was made by Councilman Williams and seconded by Councilman Jackson to accept the one bid received for the fall protection system and computer and to accept the lowest bid of \$1,458.93 from Middle GA Business Products for the fireproof file cabinet. All voted in favor with none opposed.

During Recognition of Citizens, Marques Mitchell of 1620 Woodrow Drive, Dublin, addressed the Mayor and Council with a complaint against an East Dublin Police Officer. Mayor Gornto advised Mr. Mitchell that he and any witness to the incident with the Officer, needed to bring written statements of complaint to City Administrator Larry Drew. Mayor Gornto then advised Administrator Larry Drew to look into the situation.

Being no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Councilman Jackson and seconded by Councilman Williams. All voted in favor with none opposed.
