

THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE EAST DUBLIN MAYOR AND COUNCIL

December 14, 2015

The regular meeting of the East Dublin Mayor and Council was called to order by Mayor George H. Gornito.

Invocation was led by Councilman Brown followed by pledge to the flag.

A motion was made by Councilman Jackson and seconded by Councilman Young to approve the minutes of the previous meeting. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion to approve the bills was made by Councilman Tanner and seconded by Councilman Brown. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion to add "Surplus Property" to the agenda was made by Councilman Jackson and seconded by Councilman Young. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion to surplus and advertise for sealed bid the 1986 Chevrolet Dually Truck from the Water Department was made by Councilman Jackson and seconded by Councilman Young. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion to adopt the Body Camera policy for the Police Department was made by Councilman Jackson and seconded by Councilman Young. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion to approve the renewal of all alcohol licenses listed for the year 2016 was made by Councilman Jackson and seconded by Councilman Tanner. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion was made by Councilman Brown and seconded by Councilman Young to accept the lowest bid of \$1,342.00 for a printer for the Clerk's Office from Office Max. All voted in favor with none opposed.

Mayor Gornto advised the Council that the EPD said that there was a problem with our oxidation pond and is mandating that the City do testing around the pond. He advised that the City has received a bid for a portion of the testing needed in the amount of \$23,300.00, and, the City will also do some of the testing as well. After discussion, a motion was made by Councilman Tanner and seconded by Councilman Jackson to set aside \$25,000.00 to pay for testing that will be done at the oxidation pond per mandates of the EPD. All voted in favor with none opposed.

During Council Comments, Mayor Gornto advised the Council that the nuisance properties of 107 Attwood, 401 Daley, 101 Marion and 406 Oakwood went before the Municipal Court Judge on December 7, 2015 and the Judge ordered that the property owners had 60 days to correct the situation.

Being no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Councilman Jackson and seconded by Councilman Young. All voted in favor with none opposed.
