

THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE EAST DUBLIN MAYOR AND COUNCIL

March 14, 2016

The regular meeting of the East Dublin Mayor and Council was called to order by Mayor George H. Gornto.

Invocation was led by Councilman Tanner followed by pledge to the flag.

A motion was made by Councilman Jackson and seconded by Councilman Young to approve the minutes of the previous meeting. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion to approve the bills was made by Councilman Williams and seconded by Councilman Jackson. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion to adopt the Hazard Mitigation Plan was made by Councilman Tanner and seconded by Councilman Brown. All voted in favor with none opposed. (See Attached Resolution Copy)

A motion was made by Councilman Jackson and seconded by Councilman Young to accept the appointments of City personnel. All voted in favor with none opposed. (See Attached Name List)

Discussion was made in reviewing the Zoning Board, Zoning Appeals Board and the Recreation Board. Mayor Gornto advised that Larry Kight will replace George Bassett on both the Zoning Board and the Appeals Board. The Council was also made aware that one person, Tina Baldwin on the Recreation Board, has moved and her place needs to be filled. Mayor Gornto asked the Council to have a name of someone willing to serve on the Recreation Board by the next Council meeting.

After discussion, a motion was made by Councilman Williams and seconded by Councilman Jackson to approve Larry Kight to serve on both the Zoning Board and the Zoning Appeals Board. All voted in favor with none opposed. (See Attached Name List)

A motion was made by Councilman Jackson and seconded by Councilman Williams to adopt the Statewide Mutual Aid and Assistance Agreement. All voted in favor with none opposed.

Carolyn Norris of 312 Jackson Street, East Dublin, addressed the Mayor and Council with a couple of concerns. The first was that people driving up and down Attaway Street where her mother lives were speeding. She asked if there could be some speed breaks installed along the street to help deter drivers from speeding. The other concern was that there has been a party that is going on in the area of her neighborhood that plays loud music. She advised that the music begins around 8:00 pm and goes late in the evening. She stated that this party happens 2 to 3 times a week and all weekend. Councilman Tanner advised her that he also hears the same loud music at his house and he and Mayor Gornto advised her to call 911 to have an officer to patrol the area. Mrs. Norris also asked if a Neighborhood Watch team was in her area. Mayor Gornto

said there had been one in the past, but wasn't sure if it was still active. Mrs. Norris expressed an interest in getting involved and Mayor Gornto asked her to give her contact information to the City Clerk would then give it to Police Chief Bill Luecke to help her get a new Neighborhood Watch team started.

Being no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Councilman Jackson and seconded by Councilman Williams. All voted in favor with none opposed.
