Safety Equipment Needed for Each Boat

- 1. Wearable PFD's of the approved size for each person on board. If the boat is over 16 ft. in length, a throw able device is also required.
- 2. Boats must have a valid registration with registration numbers properly displayed.
- 3. Valid fishing licenses and picture I.D. are required on board the boat for each person fishing.
- 4. Boat must have running lights if operated at night. Red and Green lights on bow and white light, visible from 360 degrees, on the rear. A white anchor light must be displayed at night.
- 5. If your boat requires a fire extinguisher, make sure it is serviceable.
- 6. Use of the cutoff (kill) switch while operating your boat is highly recommended.
- 7. Georgia has a 100-foot law that requires idle speed at locations such as bridges, docks, piers, persons in the water, etc. You are responsible for any damage your wake may cause.
- 8. You must fish in State waters open to the public on the Oconee River.
- 9. You are responsible to make Weigh-In time. If you are close to the prize money, DON'T LEAVE as you may need to take a polygraph test. If you leave or decline to take a polygraph, you may forfeit any prizes you may have won.
- 10. In case of inclement weather, please use caution and protect yourself. The tournament will continue.
- 11. Please be cautious because there are locations in the river where obstructions are below the water surface.
