

## THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE EAST DUBLIN MAYOR AND COUNCIL

October 12, 2020

The regular meeting of the East Dublin Mayor and Council was called to order by Mayor George Gornto.

Invocation was led by Councilman Brown followed by pledge to the flag.

A motion was made by Councilman Williams and seconded by Councilwoman Roberson to approve the minutes as read of the previous meeting. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion was made by Councilman Tanner and seconded by Councilman Brown to approve the bills that also included a late submission from Quality Septic Tank. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion was made by Councilwoman Roberson and seconded by Councilman Williams to approve the financial statement. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion was made by Councilman Brown and seconded by Councilman Sheppard to add to the agenda "Resolution for a 60-Day Moratorium on Residential Substance Abuse Facilities". All voted in favor with none opposed.

After discussion on the resolution, a motion was made by Councilman Brown and seconded by Councilman Tanner to adopt the Resolution for a 60-Day Moratorium on Residential Substance Abuse Facilities. All voted in favor with none opposed. (See Attached Copy)

A motion was made by Councilman Sheppard and seconded by Councilman Williams to surplus two pick-up trucks, a 2002 Ford F-150 and a 2006 Ford F-150, from the water department and advertise for bid on Govdeals.com. All voted in favor with none opposed.

During "Recognition of Citizens", LaVenus Brown from the East Dublin Head Start Program addressed the Mayor and Council with an issue she was having with people putting all kinds of garbage in the dumpster that is for the Head Start, which spills over onto the ground. She asked if there could be some kind of lock put on the dumpster. Mayor Gornto advised that the City would contact Evans Disposal to see if a lock was possible.

Also during "Recognition of Citizens", Early Clover of 406 Attaway Street, East Dublin, addressed the Mayor and Council about people speeding up and down Attaway Street. He stated that he was concerned about the kids in the area playing and asked if there could be some speed bumps installed on Attaway. Mayor Gornto advised that Police Chief Bill Luecke would have officers patrol the area more to see if that would help.
