

THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE EAST DUBLIN MAYOR AND COUNCIL

December 13, 2021

The regular meeting of the East Dublin Mayor and Council was called to order by Mayor Pro-Tem Braxton Brown, Jr.

Invocation was led by Councilman Tanner followed by pledge to the flag.

A motion was made by Councilman Williams and seconded by Councilman Sheppard to approve the minutes of the previous meeting as read. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion was made by Councilman Tanner and seconded by Councilwoman Roberson to approve the financial statements. All voted in favor with none opposed.

Alcohol license applications were reviewed for renewal for the year 2022 as follows:

After discussion, a motion to approve the renewal of all alcohol licenses listed for the year 2022 was made by Councilman Williams and seconded by Councilman Tanner. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion was made by Councilman Sheppard and seconded by Councilman Tanner to adopt the Redistricting Resolution along with the attached proposed district map that shows 42 people will be moved from District #2 to District #1 to comply with the 5.0% variance rule. It was noted that District #3 with a 1.8% variance was in the 5.0% variance rule and was not changed. All voted in favor with none opposed. (See Attached Copy)

A motion was made by Councilwoman Roberson and seconded by Councilman Williams to approve the lowest bid for a pickup truck for the fire department from Jimmy Britt Chrysler Dodge in the amount of \$30,546.00. All voted in favor with none opposed. (See Attached Copy)

A motion was made by Councilwoman Roberson and seconded by Councilman Sheppard to approve \$10,760.00 that will give employees, other than public safety, a \$1,000.00 who stood their posts during the COVID-19 pandemic. It was noted that the public safety employees, 7 police officers and 3 firemen, will be receiving \$1,000.00 each from the State of Georgia for staying their posts during the pandemic. All voted in favor with none opposed.

The Workers' Compensation Bids were presented to the Council as follows:

Key Risk (current carrier)	\$36,895.00
Encova	\$26,104.00

After discussion, a motion to go with the lowest bid from Encova for \$26,104.00 was made by Councilman Williams and seconded by Councilman Sheppard. All voted in favor with none opposed.

Being no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Councilman Williams and seconded by Councilwoman Roberson. All voted in favor with none opposed.
