

THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE EAST DUBLIN MAYOR AND COUNCIL

January 10, 2022

The regular meeting of the East Dublin Mayor and Council was called to order by Mayor George Gornto.

Invocation was led by Councilman Brown followed by pledge to the flag.

A motion was made by Councilman Williams and seconded by Councilman Sheppard to approve the minutes as read of the previous meeting. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion was made by Councilman Tanner and seconded by Councilwoman Roberson to approve the financial statements. All voted in favor with none opposed.

At this time, Mayor Gornto asked that Mayor Pro-Tem Braxton Brown take the meeting for the purpose of nominating and approving a new Mayor Pro-Tem.

Mayor Pro-Tem Braxton Brown proceeded with asking the Council for a nomination for a new Mayor Pro-Tem to serve for the year of 2022.

After discussion, a motion to nominate and approve Councilwoman Brenda Roberson as Mayor Pro-Tem on a one-year term basis was made by Councilman Tanner and seconded by Councilman Sheppard. All voted in favor with none opposed.

Mayor Gornto opened the floor for Recognition of Citizens.

Early Clover of 406 Attaway Street, East Dublin addressed the Mayor and Council with a request to have the turn signal markings on the road redone where Buckeye Road comes into Central Drive. He stated to the Council that the markings have faded away. Mayor Gornto advised Mr. Clover that the City would contact the Georgia Department of Transportation to have the markings redone.

Merita Sammons, of 501 Northside Drive, East Dublin, then addressed the Mayor and Council about the drainage issue in her yard. She stated that the gravel and pipe that was installed by the City has washed away and water is backing up into her yard again. Mayor Gornto advised Ms. Sammons that the City has done all it knew to do to correct the issue in her yard, but, would contact someone with Laurens County Public Works that may be able to help with the issue.

Ms. Sammons also told the Council about a portion of road at the corner of Northside and Creek where it has washed away and needs to be fixed. Mayor Gornto also advised that the City would send the East Dublin Public Works department to check on the issue with the road.

Being no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Councilman Williams and seconded

by Councilman Sheppard. All voted in favor with none opposed.
