

THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE EAST DUBLIN MAYOR AND COUNCIL

February 14, 2022

The regular meeting of the East Dublin Mayor and Council was called to order by Mayor George Gornto.

Invocation was led by Councilman Tanner followed by pledge to the flag.

A motion was made by Councilman Williams and seconded by Councilwoman Roberson to approve the minutes as read of the previous meeting. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion was made by Councilman Brown and seconded by Councilman Sheppard to approve the bills for payment. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion was made by Councilman Tanner and seconded by Councilman Brown to approve the financial statements. All voted in favor with none opposed.

The bids for the purchase of 100 new garbage carts were presented as follows:

Toter	\$62.50/cart - \$6,250.00
Wastebuilt	\$76.14/cart - \$7,613.75

After discussion, a motion was made by Councilman Williams and seconded by Councilman Sheppard to approve the lowest bid from Toter in the amount of \$6,250.00. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion was made by Councilwoman Roberson and seconded by Councilman Tanner to surplus a 2005 Ford F-150 pickup truck from the Public Works Department and place on GovDeals.com. All voted in favor with none opposed.

At this time, Mayor Gornto opened the floor for Recognition of Citizens.

Merita Sammons, of 501 Northside Drive, East Dublin, then addressed the Mayor and Council about an update on the drainage issue in her yard. Mayor Gornto advised Ms. Sammons that the City has contacted someone with the Laurens County Public Works and they advised that the County will install a solid pipe to collect the water that will drain into the ditch, but, will not be able to do the work until summer time so the ground will be dry enough to work.

Dawn Wood of 123 Lakeview Drive, East Dublin then addressed the Mayor and Council about having a basketball court built at Warnock Park. Mayor Gornto then advised Mrs. Wood that the City, along with the East Dublin Recreation Board, have plans in progress to turn the tennis courts at Warnock Park into a basketball court.

Being no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Councilman Williams and seconded by Councilman Sheppard. All voted in favor with none opposed.
