

THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE EAST DUBLIN MAYOR AND COUNCIL

April 18, 2022

The regular meeting of the East Dublin Mayor and Council was called to order by Mayor George Gornto.

Invocation was led by Councilman Tanner followed by pledge to the flag.

A motion was made by Councilman Tanner and seconded by Councilman Brown to approve the minutes as read of the previous meeting once amendments were made to Paragraph 6 by changing the number of traffic cameras and of intersections from three (3) to two (2). All voted in favor with none opposed. (See Attached Copy with Amendments)

A motion to approve the bills was made by Councilwoman Roberson and seconded by Councilman Sheppard. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion was made by Councilman Williams and seconded by Councilman Sheppard to approve the financial statements. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion was made by Councilman Brown and seconded by Councilman Sheppard to add to the agenda "Buckeye & Warnock Parks". The motion also included addressing "Buckeye & Warnock Parks" and approving the quote for \$17,000.00 from Bracewell Swing Factory that the East Dublin Recreation Board presented for new playground equipment for Buckeye Park and repairs and upgrades to both Buckeye Park and Warnock Park. All voted in favor with none opposed. (See Attached Copy)

At this time, Mayor Gornto opened the floor for Recognition of Citizens. No one was present at this time.

At this time, Mayor Gornto opened the floor for Council Comments.

Mayor Gornto addressed the Council concerning the need for two more people for the East Dublin Recreation Board. He asked the Council to check with folks in their districts who may be interested.

Mayor Gornto also advised that "No Trucks Allowed" signs were already up on Carroll Street and that new "No Trucks Allowed" signs had been ordered to be placed on Branham Street.

Councilman Brown addressed the Council concerning the bad condition of Railroad Avenue due to large trucks traveling on the road. Mayor Gornto stated that Railroad Avenue was paved to accommodate large trucks, but, it and Bank Street were very much in need up repairs.

Being no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Councilman Williams and seconded by Councilman Tanner. All voted in favor with none opposed.
