

THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE EAST DUBLIN MAYOR AND COUNCIL

July 11, 2022

The regular meeting of the East Dublin Mayor and Council was called to order by Mayor George Gornto.

Invocation was led by Councilman Brown followed by pledge to the flag.

A motion was made by Councilman Williams and seconded by Councilman Tanner to approve the minutes as read of the previous meeting. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion to approve the bills was made by Councilman Brown and seconded by Councilwoman Roberson. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion was made by Councilman Tanner and seconded by Councilman Brown to approve the financial statements. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion was made by Councilman Williams and seconded by Councilwoman Roberson to add three items to the agenda; "Land Purchase", "Hofstadter and Assoc. Invoice" and "Well Upgrade". All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion was made by Councilman Tanner and seconded by Councilman Williams to approve the purchase of land on Larsen Street in the amount of \$5,500.00 for the land and set aside \$2,000.00 for legal costs. This purchase is for a new sanitary sewer lift station to be place for the upcoming Phase I Larsen Street Sewer Project. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion was made by Councilman Williams and seconded by Councilman Brown to approve the payment of the Hofstadter and Assoc. invoice in the amount of \$16,307.50 for engineering and survey work for the upcoming Phase I Larsen Street Sewer Project. All voted in favor with none opposed.

A motion was made by Councilman Williams and seconded by Councilman Tanner to approve the upgrades to Well #3 and Well #4 in the amount of \$6,420.00 that was mandated by the EPD. All voted in favor with none opposed.

At this time, Mayor Gornto opened the floor for "Recognition of Citizens".

Brenda Cason of 202 Kings Rd., East Dublin, addressed the Mayor and Council regarding the faded road markings on Buckeye Road coming into Central Drive. She advised that she was attempting to come from Buckeye Road and go straight across Central Drive to the grocery store and was nearly hit by a vehicle turning left out of the grocery store onto Central Drive. She stated that the markings on the road are faded out badly, making them hard to see. Mayor Gornto advised Ms. Cason that the City had contacted the Georgia Department of Transportation and
